The Traditional Healing Program in collaboration with our ancestral Rio Yaqui Healers is working to preserve the Yaqui traditional medicines.

The Yaquis of Arizona and Sonora are reviving Yaqui medicines into the western world. By this integration, we are able to share the art of healing of the spirit, mind and body, using our cultural medicines and beliefs. The goal is to return to using our cultural medicines for healing.

Healers are scheduled on a monthly basis for two weeks at a time (subject to change). Traditional Healers (Hitevi) are available to provide traditional healing services to Tribal members. The Healer/Hitevi will advise and recommend treatment(s), which may include herbal medicine(s), massages, counseling, ceremonies, spiritual healing and prayer at no cost. The PYT is supporting the Healer for their services.

Strict confidentiality is monitored and minimal information is recorded.

Requests for services after 5:00 p.m. outside of Tribal facility are not part of the PYT Program.

Eligibility: Pascua Yaqui Centered Spirit Programs provides general mental health and substance abuse services for enrolled Pascua Yaqui tribal members, their spouse/partners and children under age 18 who reside in Pima and Maricopa counties or surrounding areas. Behavioral health services are provided at no charge; however, you must enroll in the Centered Spirit Behavioral Health Program. That enrollment process will request that you also be screened and if eligible, you must apply for AHCCCS (the state of Arizona's Medicaid program).

How to Access Centered Spirit Program Services:

Any eligible community member may call the Centered Spirit Program office to inquire about services. You will be asked some basic questions and then scheduled to meet with a Member Services Specialist. The Member Services Specialist will meet with you to assess what types of services you need. Then you will be scheduled to meet with a treatment professional to create your Treatment Plan with counseling goals you develop.

New Beginnings Clinic

Provides services at the reservation health facility only for PYT members and their families who seek treatment for Opioid addiction through Methadone maintenance and Suboxone.

There will be a counseling session, medical evaluation, and orientation prior to admission and dosing.

<u>Men's Pascua Assessment, Treatment, Healing</u> <u>Program (PATH)</u>

Provides residential treatment services at its reservation facility for males over 18 years who are PYT members or related to PYT members and other Native Americans. If space is available, clients enrolled in other federally recognized tribes are eligible. All PATH clients must be over the age of 18 and seeking a quality sober lifestyle. There is a screening conducted for eligibility determination.

St. Mary's Program

Outpatient Behavioral Health Services are available to adults, children and families experiencing challenges in their lives. Clinicians are available to provide individual, family and group therapies using various therapeutic techniques, case management and acu-detox.

Nurse Practitioner provides medication services and offers nutritional and herbal supplements and meditation skills.

Program located behind St. Mary's Hospital in the Century Medical Plaza located at 1701 W. St. Mary's Road, Suite 120.

Transitional Treatment Program

The PYT Transitional Treatment Program Provides Inpatient Transition Living Housing to include Outpatient Alcohol & Substance Abuse & Parenting Counseling Services for PYT Tribal Members with Children on their Road to Recovery. These services include but are not limited to:

- Individual counseling with TTP Manager and/or CSP Clinician.
- Group counseling weekly TTP Group and/or other groups as identified.
- → Family counseling with CSP Clinician and/or Social Services Department.
- Parenting Classes.
- → Life Skills Classes to include starting a savings account to transition to own place.
- → 12 Step Program attend AA/NA self help group & provide verification to TTP Manager.
- Prevention/Education with TTP Manager and/or CSP Clinician - must be willing to provide on-going random UA and participate with random on-going home inspections.
- Case Management on-going to include referral to Psychiatrist, Alternative Medicine, Transportation (24/7 for medical appt) and/or provide support for court hearings.

Maternal Child Health Program (520) 879-6299

The Community Health Nursing (CHN) and Community Health Representatives (CHR) Program provides community health nursing services to individuals and families within the Yoeme communities. Care plans are established through visits to homes, clinics, and communities in order to provide patient care, counseling, health educated and referral services. Special emphasis is placed on Maternal and Child Care as well as hospital discharges and follow-up with dialysis patients.

We assist with identifying and accessing other medical services that may be needed, providing direct nursing services, performing health status assessments and conducting public health surveillance. Coordination of patient care includes discharge planning, home visits, consultations with medical providers and ongoing monitoring in the home or care facility.

Our Community Health Nurses are licensed by the state of Arizona and are experienced in working with the tribal membership. Our Community Health Representatives are trained and experienced professional community health care providers supervised by tribally employed nurses and doctors.

Eligibility: enrolled tribal members and their families within Pima County and in Maricopa County, and surrounding areas.

Access to the CHN Program is by *referrals* from health care providers, hospitals, other Tribal programs, and by community members calling the office. The first step is a health status assessment, which will result in a care plan.

Specialty Services and Screening Services:

- → Patient Education & Screening: for promotion of health/disease prevention, especially related to diabetes, family planning, obesity and general health maintenance.
- Patient Advocacy: assisting patients with obtaining medical care, prescription medications through AHCCCS plans, or the Phoenix Indian Medical Center.
- → Health Promotion/Care Coordination: for all patients enrolled in the Community Health Nursing Program
- Patient Assessments: Provide a comprehensive nursing assessment to patients who would like to be enrolled in our program.
- Medication Management: Medication delivery and medication boxes filled by CHN weekly or bi-monthly
- Nursing care services: is provided in patient's homes or the office setting for chronic medical conditions or for post-discharge care.
- Case management: is completed for complex health related situations for coordination of care.
- → Immunizations and TB testing: offered to Adults and Children
- Walk-in pregnancy testing and counseling and assistance/referral for prenatal care
- Transportation escort to medical appointments on a caseby case-basis
- Community Emergency Response trained staff.
- Dialysis CHN liaison for dialysis clients
- Specific nursing care for Maternal Child Health with coordination of services with WIC.

<u>Itom Takaa Te Nake</u> (HIV/AIDS Prevention Program)

The Home and Community Based Service Program serves enrolled community members in Pima and Maricopa counties who meet program eligibility requirements for long-term care and home health services. Two programs are offered: **ALTCS** is Arizona Long Term Care Services, and an AHCCCS program for elders and the physically disabled.

Services may include:

- Community Health Nurse home visits
- Attendant Care Provider home visits
- Home Delivered Meals
- Transportation for Medical Appointments Escort as Necessary
- Nursing Care Facility Placement

ALTCS Eligibility:

There is a two-step process involved:

- (1) Is the financial eligibility. Resources are accounted for and include but are not limited to: employment income, disability income, savings accounts and other resources.
- (2) Is the medical eligibility. The pre-admission screening is part of the medical process. Both are reviewed and determined by State AHCCCS employees.

The State AHCCCS staff will determine if someone is at risk of institutionalized care. It considers a person's ability to perform daily living activities, communication skills, continence, behavior, and medical conditions among other things. The Primary Care Physician's notes and input are also used to determine medical eligibility.

Once a tribal member is determined to be eligible for ALTCS and has completed an HCBS intake process, a case manager will be assigned and work directly with the member and the member's family. This will insure that the member receives all

services in their care plan and monitors the medical progress of the member.

We Care Program: This is a tribally funded program for Elders, the physically disabled and those who were not eligible for ALTCS and occasionally new mothers who had difficult births. Under the We Care Program, eligible members will receive basic home services by certified attendant care providers. Individual service plans may include homemaking, personal care, general supervision, and companionship.

Referrals are needed from a primary care physician to schedule an appointment.

Nutritional deficiencies. Obesity. Nonalcoholic fatty liver disease, Cirrhosis, GI infections, Colorectal cancer and Viral hepatitis - any esophagus. stomach, liver or intestional problems.
- Gynecology Includes: Women's Menstrual Issues, Pap Smears (normal/abnormal), Contraception, Urinary Problems and Simple Procedures

- JVN Retinal Imaging vision screening for glaucoma or other eye issues
- Nephrology various kidney disease process
- Orthoplus new technology to assist with pain in joints, muscles, back, arms, legs or sciatic
- Podiatry Includes: Nail Trimming, Diabetic Foot Care, Ingrown Toenails, Diabetic Ulcers, Orthotics, Callus Removal
- → Podiatry / Senior Center ***For Seniors Only*** Includes: Nail Trimming, Diabetic Foot Care, Ingrown Toenails, Diabetic Ulcers, Orthotics, Callus Removal
- Physical Therapy Includes: Treatment services to restore or improve muscle tone, joint mobility, or physical function ordered by a physician

DaVita Dialysis Center is located in the Hiak Hitevi Kari Building (Westside).

The dialysis is operated by the Davita Corporation under contract with the Tribe.

DaVita Dialysis Center provides ESRD (End Stage Renal Disease) services to patients with kidney failure.

Services available to ESRD patients include, but are not limited to the following:

- → Staff-assisted hemodialysis as prescribed by the patient's physician.
- Self-dialysis in selected centers.
- → Initial and ongoing patient and family education regarding the management of and treatment options for ESRD.
- Comprehensive social services and dietary evaluation and counseling.
- → In cooperation with local hospitals, laboratories and transplant facilities, evaluation of patients for renal transportation.
- → Followed by Nephrologist and a nurse practitioner.

The Dialysis Center has 13 dialysis chairs and offers dialysis from 5:15 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Friday and from 5:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday.

Support staff at the Dialysis Center includes a Facility Administrator, nurse, patient care technician, social worker, and dietician.

Each patient treated at the Tribal Dialysis Center must have a treating physician who has been granted privileges to admit patients to the Dialysis Center.

Dental Center

The clinic hours are from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. weekdays

The Tribal Dental Center is a modern, state of the art dental facility equipped with ten dental suites. The entire office is paperless with all dental charting on a computer database. Each dental operatory has its own computer monitor with a flat screen.

Daily schedules, radiographs and treatment plans are available immediately.

The staff consists of a dental director, office manager, seven part-time dentists, 2 oral surgeons, a periodontist, an anesthesiologist, two hygienists, 9 dental assistants, Business Assistant, and dental residents from Lutheran Medical Center. Dental hygiene interns from Pima Community College rotate through for prevention. We also partner with Carrington College and Pima Medical Institute for chair side rotations.

To be seen at the Dental Center, you must be an enrolled Tribal member or dependent child (up to the age of 19) of an enrolled Tribal member. Every year, patients must complete an AHCCCS/Alternate Resource screening before your next scheduled appointment. Primary insurance will be used first if you have private insurance, (i.e. MetLife, Cigna, including AHCCCS).

The Tribe provides comprehensive dental services with the exclusion of:

- Orthodontia (Braces); and
- Temporomandibular Joint Dysfunction

We utilize several Tucson based specialist(s) for adults and children if we cannot provide the service at the Dental Center. This therapy is performed only after proper referral from a staff dentist is recommended.

<u>Diabetes Prevention & Treatment Program</u>

Includes Wellness Center Fitness and Recreational Activities & Outreach Nutrition Education

The community dietician can also provide 1:1 or family nutrition counselling. The program also offers a range of physical activity and recreational opportunities at the Wellness center and in the community for PYT Tribal members, their dependents, and tribal employees.

The Drug Testing (DT) Lab Services, since July 2001, offers services for tribal community members of any age. Offering quick and accurate testing to determine if an individual has used certain drugs may help address a potential problem. Testing for community members is by urine analysis only. Should some one test positive or require some assistance, we can refer you to the appropriate program for assistance. Further testing for continued use is also available upon request. All results are reviewed with the requester.

All testing is confidential and the only requirements are to bring a photo I.D. and proof of social security number or enrollment I.D. (other ID's are acceptable, call for information). A parent/guardian must come in to verify identification of a minor.

First drug screen is free of charge; additional drug screenings are \$9.00. Confirmation screens are available for \$30 per drug of abuse. Call for detailed information.

Other services: Upon request, the program also provides drug and alcohol prevention education to schools, employees, and communities. For more information on drug and alcohol prevention presentations please contact the DT Lab Services at the above numbers.

The DT Lab Services provides on-going services for the Tribal Human Resources Department, the Social Services Division, the Athletic Commission, the tribal court programs, and the New Beginnings Clinic.

Domestic Violence intervention services: please call for schedule

The Hiapsi Kuakte Program provides services in Pima County and surrounding areas for PYT members and their families who have been court mandated to domestic violence intervention services for felony or misdemeanor offenses involving the acts of violence. Self-referrals are also accepted. Services may include:

- → Educational Sessions on life skills, personal responsibility, and accountability with an emphasis on Yoeme culture. Separate sessions are conducted (when applicable).
- Prevention/Intervention Workshops/Education throughout the Yoeme communities.
- Crisis on-call services: 24/7, always available by telephone.
- Reporting individual progress to referral agencies.

To access the program Call-in or Walk-in and complete an initial screening:

- 1) <u>Walk-ins</u>: Bring photo ID, agency referral, and police report.
- 2) <u>Call-ins:</u> bring photo ID, agency referral, and police report on date of enrollment appointment.
 - An enrollment appointment will be scheduled for <u>Monday -</u> <u>Fridays according to availability</u>.
- Come to enrollment appointment as scheduled. If you do not meet the criteria of the program your referral agency will be notified or if, HKP deems that you require additional services, referrals and recommendation will be completed.

When the enrollment process is completed, the client is to attend the men's or women's group sessions at least one time a week. The number of group sessions a client is to complete varies for each participant.

The Pascua Yaqui Transportation Program provides medically related non-emergency transportation to members (their non-Yaqui spouses and dependant children) of the Pascua Yaqui communities in Pima, Marana and Maricopa Counties. Patients are transported to medical and health care provider sites only.

Transportation will be provided to and from appointments in a timely, professional manner, on weekdays except for holidays, and Saturdays for Dialysis patients only. Transportation for dialysis patients should be arranged through their Community Health Nurse.

3-days advance notice is needed for requests for health related transportation. Same day requests may be accommodated only if space is available and require that the patient show a Proof of appointment verification to the Transportation Driver for the return trip. It is best to call to request transportation when your appointment is scheduled.

<u>Transportation services are limited to the following:</u>

- 1. Patients with health related appointments that have no means of transportation to non-emergent appointments at health facilities.
- 2. Patients on oxygen who can operate their own portable oxygen unit.
- 3. Responsible adults accompanying:
 - a. elderly needing assistance.
 - b. children with appointments.
 - physically or mentally disabled patients not able to take care of themselves.

<u>Transportation is not available to the Methadone Clinic, any pharmacy, AA meetings, or counseling sessions.</u>

WIC is a nutrition program that helps families feed their children healthy foods. WIC provides nutrition information, healthy food, and help accessing health care to moderate to low-income families. The program is available to families with pregnant women, new mothers, and children under the age of five.

What Can WIC Offer My Family?

- Checks that can be used at the grocery store to buy healthy foods like milk, yogurt, whole grains, beans, juice, eggs, cheese, cereal, peanut butter and fruit and vegetables.
- Information about nutrition and health to help you and your family eat well and be healthy
- → Help with breastfeeding your baby
- Help in finding health care and other community services
- Breast pumps to help you breastfeed even when you return to work

Can My Family Enroll In WIC?

WIC is for all kinds of families - families with married or single parents and those who are working or not working. WIC has different requirements than SNAP (Food Stamps) so even if you don't qualify for SNAP, you may still qualify for WIC.

If you are a father, mother, grandparent, foster parent or other legal guardian of a child under 5 years of age, you can apply for your child. If you are a woman who is pregnant, breastfeeding, or has a baby up to six months old, you can apply for yourself.

Yoeme Managed Care Program

The Yoeme Health Program (YHP) is <u>not</u> an insurance plan or entitlement program and does not guarantee payment for services provided. The Program assists eligible tribal members residing in Pima County with health care services. In order to be eligible you must first apply for alternate resources such as AHCCCS, Medicare and/or Private Insurance. The Yoeme Health Program is a federally funded program that offers Purchase Referred Care (PRC) for eligible participants, through the use of limited funds provided through the local IHS Area office. The program provides patient advocacy and assistance to apply for various health programs.

Patient Advocacy services may include helping tribal members apply for AHCCCS, Medicare or help to find other coverage to meet patients' health care needs. The Program Patient Advocate/Benefits Coordinators will also help you if you receive medical bills or denial letters.

The Yoeme Health Program covers most health care needs for eligible Tribal members living in Pima County. Basic services are provided at the El Rio clinics listed in the front of this handbook. Don't wait until you are ill to enroll in the Yoeme Health Program. Apply now to ensure that you and your family can get health services when needed. Please check your member handbook for a full listing of covered and non-covered benefits. Please be aware that these services are based on available funding.

Types of services that may be available are:

- 1. El Rio Clinic office visits and specialist visits when authorized by your El Rio doctor.
- 2. Complete pregnancy care, before, during and after delivery as well as newborn/neonatal care.
- 3. Hospital care.

- 4. Pharmacy
- 5. Medical supplies and equipment when medically necessary.

In addition, preventive services are provided to keep you and your family healthy. The following are some of the services available that you should discuss with your El Rio doctor:

- 1. Immunizations
- 2. Pneumonia and Flu Shots
- 3. Screening for Diabetes
- 4. Mammograms
- 5. PAP Smears
- 6. Prostate Exams
- 7. TB Skin Test

Optical Services

Members residing within Pima County are eligible for limited optical services under the Yoeme Health Program. Members must have a current and completed Alternate Resource application (i.e. AHCCCS, Medicare etc.). Since funding is limited, members are required to utilize alternate resources such as Vision service Program (VSP), Private Vision Insurance and AHCCCS primarily. Copays will be the responsibility of the member when an alternate resource is available. If you choose to go to a provider of your choice, you will be responsible for the cost of those services.

Prior Authorization is required before seeing the contracted provider. Optical services are restricted to one (1) eye exam and one (1) pair of eye glasses/contacts every two (2) years. Children or Seniors (60+) may be eligible for services yearly based on funding and medical need.

Optical services include: Eye exam and frames/lenses or contacts at contracted rate. Additional features such as tinting, progressive lenses or other upgrades (not medically necessary) will be the responsibility of the member.

Replacement cost for lost/damaged/stolen glasses or contacts are not covered by the program, unless medically necessary.

<u>To access health services</u> through the Yoeme Health Program, you must bring the following to enroll into the Yoeme Health Program (YHP):

- 1. Tribal enrollment letter(s) for everyone you seek to enroll in the Yoeme Health Program.
- 2. Proof that you reside in Pima County; by providing at least three (3) of the following documents:
 - A Pima County rent/mortgage receipt in name of head of household.
 - A valid Arizona Motor Vehicle Operators License or Arizona State ID card with a Pima County address.
 - c. Current AZ vehicle registration issued within the last 12 months showing a Pima County address.
 - d. Official transcript from any school or college showing dependent children enrolled in a Pima County school.
 - e. Evidence of AZ Voter Registration in Pima County.
 - f. Prior year Federal or State income tax submission, indicating an address in Pima County and listing all family dependents.
 - g. Documentation from PYT Housing Department with listing of household composition.
 - h. A notarized statement providing proof of residency (as a last resort only).
- 3. Proof of Income: Check stubs for 90 days.
- Picture ID.
- Birth Certificate.
- AHCCCS ID Card.
- 7. Medicare Insurance Card.

Can I be on AHCCCS and use the Yoeme Health Program at the same time?

Request for services not covered by AHCCCS (e.g., some durable medical equipment, adult optical services) may be submitted to the Yoeme Medical Review Committee for consideration. Approval of these services may be based on funding availability. Once you are eligible for AHCCCS or other coverage, you become "ineligible" on the Yoeme Health Program. If you lose your AHCCCS eligibility or other insurance coverage, notify the Patient Advocate at 879-6012 or the El Rio Patient Benefits Coordinators at 838-7225 or 879-6139, as soon as possible, so you may re-apply under the Yoeme Health Program.
