Absentee Voting

May 7th – May 27th 2016

- You will be required to complete an absentee request form before an absentee ballot will be mailed.
- Ballot **MUST** be received to the Board of Election Office by June 6th, 2016 before 7:00 p.m.

Keeping You Informed

The Pascua Yaqui Tribe will be using The Automated Election Services (AES). This system provides security features that are critical to the integrity of the tribal elections. The AES system provides the following three key elements.

Security Feature ONE

Audit Trail Features

- Machine tape printout
- Memory Pack
- Security locked and storage of voted ballots

Security Feature Two

Automatic Voter Assistance

- If a ballot is over-voted, mismarked, or damaged, it is returned to the voter.
- Each voter has **three** opportunities for voting.

Security Feature Three

Battery Back Up

- The Memory Pack for each machine contains battery back-up.
- Vote totals can be retained and retrieved in the event of a power outage.

Automated Election Service Tabulator Certification and Sealing

- AES personnel bring Tabulators to the Pascua Yaqui Tribal Election sites.
- Tabulators (voting machines) are sealed with a propriety numbered seal.

Automated Election Service Tabulator Certification and Sealing

- The seals insure that the memory pack cannot be tampered with or compromised.
- Each Tabulator is tested and certified by members of the Pascua Yaqui Election Board of Supervisors and Poll Workers.

Ballot Production

- AES provides the production of ballots specifically designed and calibrated for use with the Tabulator voting machine.
- The ballots are produced and secured until used on election day.
- Security features printed on ballots insure that only these ballots will function on election day.

Secured Storage of Early Ballots and Tabulators

- All Early and Absentee Ballots, and Tabulators are currently being stored in a secure room at the Pascua Yaqui Tribal Police Department.
- ONLY Election Board Supervisors have **access** to the secured room. When submitting sealed absentee ballots, TWO Election Board Members **MUST** be present.
