

AHCCCS HEALTH INSURANCE

What is AHCCCS Health Insurance?

AHCCCS Health Insurance was established by the State of Arizona to provide Health Care to Arizona residents.

How do I get AHCCCS Health Insurance?

You may be able to get AHCCCS Health Insurance by contacting the CSP Office 879-6060 so that we may assist you with completing an AHCCCS application.

“If you do not qualify for AHCCCS, you are still eligible for CSP services...”

What does AHCCCS cover?

Health-e-Arizona

Documentation Needed to Complete Your Health-e-Arizona Application

If you are applying for the first time, or reapplying the items listed below may be needed to determine your eligibility. Please bring all current information to your interview; this will help to speed up the eligibility process. Keep your appointment, even if you do not have all the documents on this list.

- Social Security Cards: Social Security Numbers for everyone, or proof of application for an SSN
- Identification (for everyone)
 - Drivers License
 - Photo ID issued by federal state or local government
 - Tribal ID
 - School ID with picture
- Citizenship (for everyone)
 - U.S. Birth Certificate or Certified copy
 - U.S. Naturalization Certificate
 - U.S. Passport
 - Official Military Record of service showing U.S. place of birth (e.g., DD-214)
- Residency/Residential Address: A statement from a non-relative, not living with you, verifying your address and the names of everyone living with you. The statement must be signed, dated and include their address and telephone number. Current utility bill with applicant name and address.
- Income: All money your household received from any source last month and this month.
- Terminated Income: Terminated employment and date last paid from last month and the most recent month.
- Pregnancy: Proof of pregnancy with estimated date of delivery
- Childcare: Expense billed for childcare for the most recent month or incapacitated adult.
- Medical Expense
 - Medical expenses for the last month and this month, if you are applying for AHCCCS health insurance.
 - Medical expenses for those who are age 60 or older or receive disability benefits if applying for Food Stamps.
- Other Medical Insurance: Insurance cards for any other medical insurance other than AHCCCS

If applying for Food Stamps or TANF additional documentation (listed below) is required. The additional documentation is not a requirement for medical benefits.

- Vehicles: Registration/title for all vehicles
- Bank Accounts: Credit Union or Bank (savings or checking) complete statement for the most recent month.
- Other Assets
 - Savings bonds/securities
 - Retirement plans/life insurance
- Rent/Mortgage (for most recent month)
 - Rental/lease agreement
 - Mortgage statement/coupon book
 - Rent receipt
- Utility Expenses (for most recent month)
 - Electric bill
 - Water bill
 - Gas bill

If you need help in obtaining any verification, or you have any other questions, contact your Health-e-Arizona Application Assistor.

CSP is now linked up to HEALTH-E which can help determine if you are eligible for AHCCCS.

AHCCCS HEALTH INSURANCE (cont'd)

How do I renew my AHCCCS?

The Centered Spirit program will be happy to assist you in completing an application. It only takes an hour and can be done online here at the main office. It is very important that you complete an application before your renewal date so you do not lose your medical coverage. If you are over 18 do not have any kids and you lose AHCCCS you will be considered a childless adult and will not be able to get back onto AHCCCS.



What do I need to complete my application?

- **Social Security Cards**– For everyone you are applying for.
- **Identification**– Drivers License, Tribal ID, School ID with picture
- **Citizenship**– Birth Certificate or Certified Copy
- **Residency/Residential Address**: A statement from a non– relative, not living with you, verifying your address and the names of everyone living with you.
- **Income**– All money your household received from any source last month and this month.
- **Pregnancy**– Proof of pregnancy.



Can I renew or apply for Nutrition assistance?

If you are receiving nutrition assistance or would like to apply we can also do that here at the centered spirit program.

- **Food stamps**: DES/FAA will determine if you qualify within 30 Calendar date of your application.
- **If you have little money or no money**, you may be eligible for emergency food stamps, which will take 7 days from the date of your application.

Arizona Launches KidsCare II: Get Healthcare Coverage for Your Kids!

Do your children or grandchildren need healthcare coverage? Then you'll be happy to hear that Arizona has launched KidsCare II, our state's low-cost health coverage for kids.

Who qualifies for KidsCare II?

- Uninsured Arizona residents up to 18 years old.
- Children in families earning up to \$40,000 annually, or even more.
- U.S. citizens or qualified non-citizens.
(A parent's immigration status does NOT affect a child's eligibility for KidsCare II. A parent's Social Security number is NOT needed when applying for KidsCare II.)

What is KidsCare II?

It's Arizona's low-cost health insurance program for children. With KidsCare II your children can receive comprehensive healthcare, including:

- doctor visits
- eye care
- prescriptions
- dental care
- hospital visits

How much does KidsCare II cost?

KidsCare II costs no more than \$40 a month –or even less- for one child. No matter how many children are in the household, KidsCare II will NOT cost more than \$60 a month.


Is KidsCare II available now?

YES, KidsCare II is available now through December 31, 2013, for a limited number of children. It's important that you act quickly to get this low-cost, comprehensive health coverage for your children. After KidsCare II expires, we can help transition your children into the Health Insurance Exchange, which will be up and running as part of the new healthcare law.





Provider Advocacy

The PY TRBHA Centered Spirit Program encourages its Providers and sub-contracted Providers to advise or advocate on behalf of the behavioral health recipient for the following:

- Behavioral Health Recipient's health status, medical care or treatment options, including any alternative treatment that may be self-administered.
- Information the Behavioral Health Recipient needs to decide among treatment options.
- Risks, benefits and consequences of treatment or non-treatment
- Behavioral Health Recipient's right to participate in treatment decisions regarding his or her behavioral health care, including the right to refuse treatment.

Definitions:

FRAUD: an intentional deception or misrepresentation made by a person with the knowledge that the deception could result in some unauthorized benefit to himself or some other person. It includes any act that constitutes fraud under applicable Federal, State, or Tribal Law.

ABUSE: A CSP Staff who's practice is not consistent with business or medical practices, and result in an unnecessary cost to the Program, or in reimbursement for services that are not medically necessary or fail to meet professionally recognized standards for health care. It also includes members who's services in an unnecessary cost to the Program.

ABUSE of MEMBER: any intentional, knowing or reckless infliction of physical harm, injury caused by negligent acts or omissions, unreasonable confinement, emotional or sexual abuse, or sexual assault.
