

SUE THAM

Where are you originally from? I am of Chinese descent and was born and raised in East India. I am Asian American, multi-cultural and multi-lingual.

Do you have a nickname? Several... Chiltepin (feisty, energetic, passionate), choti (related to my size and ordinal position: youngest) and chinita (spanish for Chinese).

Describe yourself in a single sentence? I am ACE (an adventurer, a catalyst for change and empower others) and pretty good at being ACE.

What do you do in your spare time? Digging, sowing seeds and tending a garden (metaphorical).

What type of music do you enjoy? Almost any (Ravi Shankar on sitar, Carlos Nakai on flute, Beetles, One Direction and Yaani's New age music)

What do you consider having fun? Shucking clams, crabs, oysters with my family at Redondo Beach, Asian Pacific Fitness class, participating at Toast Masters and hanging out with fun people.

What do you value most in other people? Honesty, integrity and friendship.

Who or what inspires you and why? Genuine kindness, openness of the ocean, the mountain trails that beckon one to explore, experience and wonder. I am inspired by those who help others and improve their communities through collective wisdom and action.

What is your job like? Ensuring that I work with Interprofessional teams to address clinical, operational and financial effectiveness so that we ensure holistic care to people and family at Centered Spirit. As a manager, I develop workflow process, ensure implementation of protocols, supervise and consult with others and I work with clients providing therapy, Acudetox and case management services for adults.

A typical day? Begins with greeting my spiritual leader, duties to my family, a nice cup of black tea, ride sharing to work, prioritizing my tasks, organizing my day, attending meetings or having sessions with clients. I walk to my meetings so that I can think through my problems and the walk fits well into to my exercise schedule. I am back on my educational track but it is not going to be for long. I love to cook, it is a good distraction to stress. By the end of the day, my greatest gift is my sleep.

What do you do? I work for Centered Spirit Programs. I am the Adult Services Program Manager and Deputy Associate Director.

What are the duties/functions/responsibilities of your job? I manage the Adult services team and also assist the Director of Behavioral Health with other program issues related to contracts, operational and clinical issues.

How did this type of work interest you and how did you get started? I began volunteering during my undergrad coursework with kids in special education, interned at a children's hospital and general hospital, obtained my degrees and came to the US on a Fulbright Scholarship which opened avenues of enriched experience in the field of Behavioral Health. My strong desire to experience different cultures and people led me to the Pascua Yaqui tribe. My interest regarding health and social issues and the opportunity to learn and serve others create endless hope for our community's wellness.

What are the most important personal satisfactions & dissatisfactions connected with your occupation?

Being "a part of a whole" system and witnessing what we can achieve through collective wisdom is personally gratifying. We need more people who are a part of a solution rather than those who harp about problems.

What was your first impression when you walked into the Centered Spirit Program?

My first impression when I walked into CSP was that the work is complex and that forging relationships could lead to team work, community strength and better health.

What do you like about working with the Pascua Yaqui Centered Spirit Program? I often ask this question of those who work at CSP. I believe that those who I work with have an intrinsic desire to make a difference in this community through their service to the tribe. I am one of us who wish to find different pathways to a common vision: providing the best service to the community.

How long have you been working for the tribe? 1 year and 7 months.

What is one goal that you would like to accomplish while working for the tribe? Connect on a personal level so that what matters is happiness and satisfaction in what I do for the tribe.

DID YOU KNOW?

Provider Advocacy

The PY TRBHA Centered Spirit Program encourages its Providers and sub-contracted Providers to advise or advocate on behalf of the behavioral health recipient for the following;

- Behavioral Health Recipient's health status, medical care or treatment options, including any alternative treatment that may be self-administered.
- Information the Behavioral Health Recipient needs to decide among treatment options.
- Risks, benefits and consequences of treatment or non-treatment
- Behavioral Health Recipient's right to participate in treatment decisions regarding his or her behavioral health care, including the right to refuse treatment.

Definitions

FRAUD: an intentional deception or misrepresentation made by a person with the knowledge that the deception could result in some unauthorized benefit to himself or some other person. It includes any act that constitutes fraud under applicable Federal, State, or Tribal law.

WASTE: is overutilization of services or other practices that, directly or indirectly, result in unnecessary costs to the health care system.

ABUSE: A CSP Staff who's practice is not consistent with business or medical practices, and result in an unnecessary cost to the Program, or in reimbursement for services that are not medically necessary or fail to meet professionally recognized standards for health care. It also includes members who's services in an unnecessary cost to the Program.

ABUSE of MEMBER: any intentional, knowing or reckless infliction of physical harm, injury caused by negligent acts or omissions, unreasonable confinement, emotional or sexual abuse, or sexual assault.
