AHCCCS/ALTCS-Arizona Long Term Care—this program provides quality long term care services to financially and medically eligible tribal members at little or no cost.

Childbirth Education Classes— come and share peer education on pregnancy, help create your birthing plan, learn the signs of labor along with post-partum health/well-being. Get help with breastfeeding before and after birth, discuss questions, concerns and emotions.

Community Health Nurse— provides community health nursing services to individuals and families within the community. Assessments, case management, coordination of care, consultations, counseling, direct nursing services. escorting to medical appointments, home visits, hospital discharge planning medication management, ongoing monitoring in home or in a care facility and referral services.

Community Health Representative- provides community health nursing services to individuals and families within the community. Coordination of care, escorting to medical appointments, home visits, medication management, ongoing monitoring in home or in a care facility and support care to families.

Dialysis Nurses— provides care to dialysis patients—escorts, medication assistance, home visits and support in specialist appointments.

First Things First—home visitation program for prenatal families and families with children ages birth to 5 years. The program provides participating families with information and education on parenting, child development and health topics while assisting with connections to other resources or programs as needed.

HIV/STI/Hepatitis C— provides confidential/educational services to tribal community members to prevent transmission, enhance risk reduction along with increasing individual knowledge. Dispense condoms, female condoms, dams and lubricants.

Maternal and Child Health Nurses—provide the following services to pregnant women, post -partum (after delivery), children ages newborn to 18 yr olds, Well Women and Child Asthma Control through home visiting program by case management, coordinating, arranging services, needs assessment, advocacy and health promotion and education.

Open: Walk In on Tuesday/Thursday Hours: 8:30 AM- 11:00 AM (No charge for Harm Reduction services).

We Care Program— provides homemaker services to tribally enrolled members who may not be eligible for other home health programs due to income guidelines, or where otherwise applying for services would endanger the loss of home and or property.

Services provided to enrolled community members and their families within Pima County through the Tucson Area Indian Health Service and in Maricopa Country through the Phoenix Area Indian Health Services.

Referrals accepted from health care providers, hospitals and other tribal programs.
