Dear Tribal Member on AHCCCS,

This letter is to advise you of some important changes that is occurring in the AHCCCS Program. These upcoming changes that will affect you and your families on where and how you will get your health care services. **Effective October 1, 2018**. Tribal members who are currently enrolled in the following plans: **MERCY CARE, HEALTH CHOICE, and CARE 1ST** will be moved automatically to one of the following four plans:

1. **Banner University Family Care**
2. **United Health Care Community Plan**
3. **Arizona Complete Health**
4. **American Indian Health Plan**

AHCCCS has sent out letters to inform you of the changes and for you to make a choice.

However, if you are not already on **American Indian Health Plan (AIHP)**, there are some very important benefits that you should consider. We **highly encourage** that our Tribal members choose the AIHP because this plan:

- Would provide transportation services to medical/behavioral health appointments.
- Does not have copays or deductibles.
- Would be the **ONLY** plan that will allow you to receive behavioral health services through the Pascua Yaqui TRBHA/Centered Spirit Program or the Sewa U'usim Programs.

The Pascua Yaqui Tribe (PYT) Centered Spirit Program also provides to Tribal members on AIHP the following services:

- Mentors
- Respite
- Residential Treatment
- Trauma Specialist
- Art Therapy
- Group Homes
- Transportation for Behavioral Health Appointments

If a tribal member wants to make a change but have not received a letter, they should call AHCCCS directly at 602-417-7000 or you may also call the PYT Managed Care Program at 520-879-6041.

QPR Question, Persuade, Refer Suicide Prevention Program

Suicide is one of the country's biggest concerns and least discussed topics. The national suicide rate has been on the rise since 2008 despite many efforts to address this issue. Our rate on the Pascua Yaqui reservation also continues to climb. We need to do more to address this.

The QPR Program is modeled after CPR and the Heimlich Maneuver in that many every-day citizens can use it. At the conclusion of the training participants will be able to:

- Recognize suicide warning signs (Ex. sleep issues, hopelessness).
- Intervene to question with support.
- Persuade and talk with hope and understanding.
- Refer the person to someone who can help.

The Centered Spirit program is offering an opportunity for parents and Community Members, students, grades 9-12 to attend a free 2-hour training on the QPR Program. Participants will receive the QPR Booklet and become QPR Gatekeepers.
Register for our free 2-hour trainings.
Participants do not need other training or education.

Provider Advocacy

The PY TRBHA Centered Spirit Program encourages its Providers and sub-contracted Providers to advise or advocate on behalf of the behavioral health recipient for the following:

- Behavioral Health Recipient's health status, medical care or treatment options, including any alternative treatment that may be self-administered.
- Information the Behavioral Health Recipient needs to decide among treatment options.
- Risks, benefits and consequences of treatment or non-treatment
- Behavioral Health Recipient's right to participate in treatment decisions regarding his or her behavioral health care, including the right to refuse treatment.

Definitions

FRAUD: an intentional deception or misrepresentation made by a person with the knowledge that the deception could result in some unauthorized benefit to himself or some other person. It includes any act that constitutes fraud under applicable Federal, State, or Tribal law.

WASTE: is overutilization of services or other practices that, directly or indirectly, result in unnecessary costs to the health care system.

ABUSE: A CSP Staff who's practice is not consistent with business or medical practices, and result in an unnecessary cost to the Program, or in reimbursement for services that are not medically necessary or fail to meet professionally recognized standards for health care. It also includes members who's services in an unnecessary cost to the Program.

ABUSE of MEMBER: any intentional, knowing or reckless infliction of physical harm, injury caused by negligent acts or omissions, unreasonable confinement, emotional or sexual abuse, or sexual assault.
