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AHCCCS NEWS UPDATE

ATTENTION ALL PATIENTS

Important Notice

AHCCCS will be making upcoming changes that may affect you and your families insurance.

Effective October 1st, 2018

Members may be asked to change plans since some plans may no longer be available. AHCCCS has sent out letters to inform you that you will have until

July 31st, 2018 to make a choice.

If you are **not** already on the **American Indian Health Plan (AIHP)**, there are some very important benefits that you should know about:

- AIHP will be the **only plan** that will allow you to enroll in the Pascua Yaqui TRBHA, this is important if you are receiving or plan on receiving services at Centered Spirit or Sewa Uusim programs.
- AIHP also covers *Non-Emergency* Transportation for health appointments.
- AIHP will be the **only plan** that will exempt American Indians from co-pays and deductibles.

On June 29th The Centered Spirit Program, St. Mary's Outpatient Clinic hosted a screening of the documentary film "Crazywise."

This independent film takes an earnest look at how the mental health system in the US addresses what are considered symptoms of mental illness, in contrast to how other cultures and peoples view the same symptoms. Treatment can vary widely from a medical model to a spiritual model.


The film looks at how rates of treatment with medications has skyrocketed in the US over the last decades but has not lead to decreases in the incidence of suicide or mental illness overall. The film follows two Americans diagnosed with psychosis on their journey through the mental health system.

A discussion was held after the film regarding its relevance to the Yoeme community and to the behavioral health services that are available through Centered Spirit. Definitions

FRAUD: an intentional deception or misrepresentation made by a person with the knowledge that the deception could result in some unauthorized benefit to himself or some other person. It includes any act that constitutes fraud under applicable Federal, State, or Tribal law.

WASTE: is overutilization of services or other practices that, directly or indirectly, result in unnecessary costs to the health care system.

ABUSE: A CSP Staff who's practice is not consistent with business or medical practices, and result in an unnecessary cost to the Program, or in reimbursement for services that are not medically necessary or fail to meet professionally recognized standards for health care. It also includes members who's services in an unnecessary cost to the Program.

ABUSE of MEMBER: any intentional, knowing or reckless infliction of physical harm, injury caused by negligent acts or omissions, unreasonable confinement, emotional or sexual abuse, or sexual assault.

Provider Advocacy

The PY TRBHA Centered Spirit Program encourages it's Providers and sub-contracted Providers to advise or advocate on behalf of the behavioral health recipient for the following;

- Behavioral Health Recipient's health status, medical care or treatment options, including any alternative treatment that may be self-administered.
- Information the Behavioral Health Recipient needs to decide among treatment options.
- Risks, benefits and consequences of treatment or non-treatment
- Behavioral Health Recipient's right to participate in treatment decisions regarding his or her behavioral health care, including the right to refuse treatment.
